Gove Womens Surfboat Crew in Golden Hatrick

The awesome Women's Surfboat crew from the Gove Peninsula Surf Lifesaving Club won the Open Women's Surfboat Championship for the third year in a row last weekend at the North Australian Surf Life Saving Championships in Mackay, Queensland. The crew of Denise Marrable (stroke), Greer Ashby, Brinkley Dennerley, Keara Blundell and Charles Rue (sweep) got away to a great start in the final and, at the turning buoys, were only slightly ahead of the field. But a season of hard and dedicated training paid off in the 500 metres back to shore when the Gove crew's superior fitness and technique pulled them ahead of nearest rival, Picnic Bay SLSC, as Gove made best use of the onshore running waves. Denise paid tribute to her teammates for their commitment to the sport and acknowledged the influence of the SLSA Surfboat workshop held earlier in the season by Australian Champion Jack Alliss.

Outside the boat arena there was another goldrush and more medals when Alan Cross scored gold in the Masters Surf Ski and took silver in both the Masters Swim and Masters Board races. Australian Masters Champion, Shane Ezard, was also on the podium with gold from the Masters Beach Flags and Masters Beach Sprint and a hard-earned silver in the Open Beach Sprint.

The youth of the club also showed their talent. Emma Whelan scored bronze in the U15 Beach Flags (from a field of 40!) and another bronze when she teamed up with Alice Rudolph in the U15 Board Rescue. Watch out for these talented young competitors in the future!

Telstra Beach To Bush reaches remote communities

World Ironman Champion, Zane Holmes, launched the largest and most innovative surf education program in Australia yesterday on Channel Nine's 'Today' breakfast program. The annual Telstra Beach To Bush surf safety program experienced and highly qualified surf lifesavers traveling to regional and remote primary schools to teach important basic surf safety messages and to help save lives this summer. This year's nationwide program will reach over 35,000 primary school children from more than 300 regional primary schools. While the program focuses primarily on beach safety, the aquatic safety skills can be easily applied to rivers, dams, creeks, pools and other waterways. In the Northern Territory schools in North East Arnhem Land are being targeted this year.

Bateup and Eckstein make NIB Coolangatta Gold history

Hayley Bateup and Caine Eckstein have raced their way into the history books with commanding wins in the grueling *NIB Coolangatta Gold* on the Gold Coast. Bateup, of the Kurrawa club, took out an unprecedented third title in the ultimate test of endurance and surf lifesaving skill while Eckstein, of Tugun, became only the second male competitor to win the title twice (the other was Guy Leech 1984 & 1985). Bateup finished ahead of Courtney Hancock (Northcliffe) by more than seven minutes with Alyce Bennett (Burleigh Heads/Mowbray Park) in third place while Eckstein was two and a half minutes in front of Tim Peach (Mooloolaba) and Nathan Smith (Cronulla) third.

Eckstein was in the zone for the gruelling 46 kilometre men's race and opened up a twominute lead after the board leg from Currumbin to Burleigh Heads and it was a case of "catch me if you can" as the field set off for the 10km run to Surfers Paradise. But the further the race went the further Eckstein asserted his dominance. He was among a group of seven leaders at the end of the 23 kilometre ski paddle from Surfers Paradise to Coolangatta, which was whittled to four - Eckstein, Peach, Dean Mercer (Mooloolaba) and Smith (Cronulla) - after the 3.5km swim. It was in the board leg that Eckstein was able to open up his winning lead and he entered the final 10km run back to Surfers more than a minute ahead of Smith. This year there was a 30 per cent increase in competitors, especially internationals, with around 20,000 spectators lining Gold Coast beaches to watch the iconic race.
