Shannon Eckstein and Naomi Flood were crowned Series Winners at the Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Ironman Final in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd at Sydney's Coogee Beach. Eckstein outclassed the field and reclaimed his whereas Naomi Flood struggled in the final but did just enough to secure the series and the overall women's crown. Eckstein now holds every major Ironman title – Australian, World, Nutri-Grain series – apart from the long-distance nib Coolangatta Gold, which he did not contest but was won by his brother, Caine. And there was more to celebrate as the Surf Life Saving fraternity and the crowd paid homage to the amazing Dean Mercer - after 21 years he bowed out of professional Ironman racing.

Got an offshore boat? Get an EPIRB

On 1 February 2009 the 121.5 Megahertz Distress Beacons became redundant. Distress Beacons, formerly called an EPIRB or Emergency Positioning Indicating Radio Beacon, are part of boat's compulsory safety equipment if operating outside sheltered waters (eg Darwin Harbour) and more than 2 nautical miles from the coast-approximately 3.6 km. The new Distress beacons operate on 406 MHz and are capable of carrying information about you and your boat and will greatly assist the Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) if you need search and rescue. If you go offshore boating do not risk your life - switch to a 406 MHz distress beacon now. Visit the AMSA website for all the latest information www.amsa.gov.au
