# NT Wins Interstate Handicap Trophy Again

For the second year in a row a talented NT Team has won the handicap trophy for the Surf Life Saving Interstate Team competition. The emphatic win came in big surf and difficult conditions at the 2009 Whereis® Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Scarborough Beach. SLSNT President Bob Creek said it was a great performance with many NT competitors showing great courage to tackle the wild seas that confronted them on the day. "There is no doubt this surf experience helps our members use all the skills they learn in the surf lifesaving training and it was great to see their courage and skill on the day," Bob said. Due to the heavy surf conditions, the surfboats were limited to one round of racing after officials decided it was too dangerous to continue. This was disappointing for the Gove Peninsula Womens Surfboat Crew who on Sunday competed in the pre-Aussies carnival at Fremantle and won their division against all local and interstate competition. The crew will compete again tomorrow (Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March) in the first rounds of the Australian Open Championship. ## Mindil Beach Patrol Team unflustered by shark attacks, drunks and ducks

The Mindil Beach SLSC patrol team performed creditably yesterday (Wed 18<sup>th</sup> March) at Trigg Beach in Perth when they contested the Champion Patrol competition of the 2009 Whereis® Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. The team of Craig Croke (Capt), Tony Snelling, Thanh Thanh Thai, Carney Broadbent, Moira and Michael Wigley are the first time Top End patrol team to enter this national competition and received great praise and encouragement from their competitors and the officials for their efforts. The patrol scenario was a highlight according to Captain, Craig Croke. He said the team had to check and prepare their patrol equipment in three minutes then, in the next 10 minutes they were assessed on their responded to a range of surf rescues and emergency situations. "We had a body surfer

with a broken hand, a surfer with a shark bite to the legs, two drunken men who stole a boat and rammed it into the beach - one suffering a dislocated shoulder then, to cap it all off, a distressed lady who had found a seabird with a broken wing asked us for help." Craig said it was great experience and according to some of the veteran competitors 'the most difficult patrol scenario ever used at the Australian Championships'.

### NT Duo paddle for inaugural Womens Double Ski Championship

Jo Gardiner and Sherie Tracey have paddled their way into the semi-final of the inaugural Open Womens Double Ski race at the 2009 Whereis® Australian Surf Life Saving Championships at Scarborough Beach. Their performance today in the surf was very heartening as the talented duo put on a flawless performance around the course, easily mastering the surf and out maneuvering their opposition around the triangular 750m course. This is the first year an Open Womens Double Ski Championship has been offered.

# Australia's first Surf Life Saving Club in an Indigenous Community

History was made on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2009 when Djawa Burarrwanga and Stuart Kellaway represented the fourth club to be affiliated with Surf Life Saving Northern Territory - the Walnawu Djakamirri Surf Life Saving Club. The affiliation was unanimously supported when the motion was put to affiliate the new club following a presentation about the growth and development of the club over the last 2 years. SLSNT President said the club had emerged from the highly successful Indigenous Water Safety Program for Yirrkala and the surrounding homelands communities.

It is Australia's first Surf Life Saving Club in an indigenous community.

Djawa and Stuart spoke enthusiastically about the Surf Club concept in Yirrkala and thanked the staff and volunteers for their commitment to this innovative project. Recognition was also made of the local community, especially the youth at the Yirrkala Community Education Centre and the Yirrkala Homelands School, who

worked so hard to complete the requirements of their accredited lifesaving training. There is still much work to do with a major opening of activities planned for the weekend of 13-14 June at Shady Beach, Yirrkala, including the launch of the Nipper program.

# Gove Peninsula club up for SLSA's "Club of the Year"

The selection for SLSA's 2009 Club of the Year includes the Gove Peninsula SLSC and will be announced tomorrow night (Fri 20<sup>th</sup> march) at the SLSA Awards of Excellence.
