Jo Gardiner Coolangatta Gold Hero

Jo Gardiner completed Australia's premier endurance Ironman race, the nib Coolangatta Gold, last Sunday. Starting from Surfers Paradise beach on a beautiful Gold Coast morning Jo paddled her surf ski and board, swam and ran the 30.5km course to be 8th in the Masters Womens division (see times below). Surf Life Saving NT President, Bob Creek, was one of the first to congratulate Jo and said she was an outstanding athlete with a big record of success in surf lifesaving competition. When Jo returned to Darwin on Tuesday, she thanked everyone who had sent messages of support on email and SMS. Here are Jo's times...

National IRB Review

SLSA is conducting a national review into all IRB operations to further improve member safety and reduce injuries. All aspects of IRB operations will be addressed including competition, lifesaving, equipment, training, assessing, coaching, technique, culture, and data collection. The review began in late September and initial recommendations from the panel will be presented to the relevant national boards in early 2010. Beach Patrols finishing this month

Weekend beach patrols finish this month and all lifesavers are encouraged to maintain their vigilance and advise anyone going near the water of the Top End 'Stinger Season', officially 1st October to 31st May. A huge thankyou to everyone who helped their club by donning the red and yellow uniform and being available to the hundreds of Territorians and visitors who have need advice or a helping hand. On the last day of patrol club members are urged to:

- ensure all patrol equipment is cleaned and stored in dry, well ventilated conditions.
- core lifesaving equipment should remain as 'rescue ready' as possible.

Jetski Patrols Warn Swimmers, Rescue Yacht

Members of the SLSNT Search & Rescue Team, Craig Croke, Cameron Griffin and Paddy Donohoe, visited most Darwin beaches last Sunday to ensure the Stinger Season message was getting through to people at the beach. Although most people are doing the right thing a mother and three young children were warned of the dangers and promptly heeded the advice given. Later in the afternoon a small yacht off Larrakia Point was in trouble and towed to safety. Close to sunset the focus was Mindil Beach where over 1,000 people enjoyed a very high tide and asked lots of questions of the SAR Team members and the Mindil Beach patrol. The SLSA Fact Sheet on Stingers and waterproof advice cards, highlighting the need for protective clothing during the Stinger Season and providing basic emergency care advice, are available from SLSNT.
