The college philosophy will be interactive shared learning and will relate SLSA's leadership competencies to grass roots surf life saving. Talented Darwin team retains NT Champion Club Shield

Darwin Surf Life Saving Club's talented group of over 70 competitors retained champion club status on Broome's Cable Beach last weekend at the 2008 NT Surf Life Saving Championships. The Championships saw traditional rivals, Broome and Darwin, throw everything they had at the events, producing some of the most exciting finishes seen in years.

In the Westpac Junior Championships Darwin finished only 13 points ahead of Broome, an amazingly close contest after over 60 events. We are proud to announce the following 2008 Age Champions:

In the Thrifty Senior Championships the Lifesaver Relay and Taplin Relays were special highlights with teams alongside each other as they battled for medal placings. In the individual events an amazing swim from Broome's Kane Fitzpatrick saw him snatch the 2008 Open Ironman title in the final stage of that event while in the Open Ironwoman event Rachel McLean, an U19 competitor, was unbeatable despite being up against some talented and experienced female surf women. Beach specialist John Brown's lightning fast reflexes saw him take out the Open Beach Flags title, Sam Creek and Sherie Tracy won the Open Male and Female Surf Ski race respectively and Sam backed up to add the Open Board race title as well. Despite being short on experience Broome proved their lifesaving expertise by winning both IRB racing events in choppy surf conditions. Masters competitors were there in force and their races produced some of the biggest fields on the beach and in the water. Broome's Brad Carr and Carrie Selton, and Darwin's Jo Gardiner, were stand-out competitors. But it was the depth and consistency of the Darwin team that won the day with the final score for the whole weekend being Darwin 727 points and nearest rival Broome on 558 points.
