Darwin Wave Lagoon Opens - Volunteers needed!

Saturday 2nd May is opening day for the new Darwin Wave Lagoon - bring on the waves!!!. The Wave Lagoon will be open every day from 10 am to 6 pm and is part of the Darwin Waterfront Development which includes a large Recreation Lagoon and a lovely crescent-shaped beach. Please note that you cannot take your personal surfboards or boogie boards into the Wave Lagoon. The whole precinct is patrolled by lifeguards trained to Surf Life Saving's exacting standards and most are members of local surf life saving clubs. They'll be easy to spot in their red and yellow uniforms - the national and international standard for all lifeguards.

Surf Lifesavers on the beaches this weekend

Volunteer surf lifesavers from the Territory's three surf life saving clubs - Darwin, Mindil Beach and Gove Peninsula are patrolling this weekend as part of their world-famous volunteer commitment to the safety of the public on some of Australia's most popular tropical beaches. Not only will every Active surf lifesaver have an SLSA Bronze Medallion they will also be qualified with a Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) as part of a national commitment to place our surf lifesaving awards within the Australian Qualifications framework. Many of our members have further advanced qualifications in powercraft operations and advanced emergency care. As we officially enter the dry season we extend a huge thankyou to all our volunteers who provide this essential service through to the end of October. Duty times are

Box Jellyfish Risk

Last weekend SLSNT inspected local Darwin beaches and found over 50 people bathing in the shallows - the most dangerous area for box jellyfish stings. All members are reminded that the 'Stinger Season' in the NT extends to May 31st and patrols should display a red flag when on duty. Protective clothing is required for all patrolling lifesavers and lifeguards when entering the water and is also strongly recommended for any member engaged in competition training in the open ocean. Any member of the public entering the water without protective clothing should be advised that there is a risk of dangerous marine jellyfish stings at this time of the year

and that they should leave the water immediately. Treatment for Box Jellyfish stings is remove the patient from the water, restrain if necessary, call for ambulance and antivenom, DRABCD, flood the affected area with vinegar for at least 30 seconds, perform CPR if necessary. Do not apply compression bandaging but ice packs can be used for temporary pain relief. Further information can be obtained from Director of Lifesaving Jo Gardiner on 0419 039 300.
