Tonight's broadcast of Stateline on ABC TV at 7.30 pm (Friday 19 June) will include a feature story on the Walngawu Djakamirri Surf Life Saving Club - Australia's first indigenous Surf Club. The club is based at Shady Beach, Yirrkala, approximately 25 km south of Nhulunbuy in East Arnhem Land. NT Stateline is repeated tomorrow (sat 20 June) at 12 noon.

Darwin's Fannie Bay Swim Classic Saturday June 20

The Fannie Bay Swim Classic is arguably the best open water swim in Darwin and over 120 swimmers of all ages are expected to enter. With a great weather forecast and a 5.5 metre high tide at 3.15 pm it will be a sensational afternoon of aquatic sport. The 2.1 km long course swim starts from the beach at Pee Wee's Restaurant on East Point at 2.15pm while the short course swim (approx 1.2km) starts from the beach below the Lake Alexander entrance gates. Key information for the event is...

- o All swimmers are required at the 1.00 pm race briefing at Pee Wee's Park.
- o Early Bird registration is Friday 19 June, 5.30-8.00 pm, at the TB Club or Saturday 20 June, 12.30-1.30 pm, at Pee Wee's Park.
- o First swimmer due at the Trailer Boat Club finish line around 2.40 pm; whole field should be home by 3.30pm.
- Presentations kick off around 4.00 pm celebrate with all the participants and enjoy the Trailer Boat Club's facilities and hospitality.
- o All proceeds assist the excellent work of the Darwin Surf Life Saving Club.

Welcome to Michael Chua from Singapore

Michael Chua is being hosted by SLSNT for 2 weeks as part of a new staff exchange program between Singapore and the NT. Michael is the full-time Deputy Manager of the Singapore Life Saving Society and highly qualified Lifesaver. He is also a volunteer Doping Control Officer with the SNOC, Anti-Doping in Sports Commission and a trained AED/CPR provider by the Life Support Centre of the Singapore General Hospital. His SLSA awards include the Silver Medallion Beach Management and Level 1 Surf Sports Official. Michael served his national service with the Singapore Police Force as an Inspector of Police. His period of service included being Officer-in-charge of Patrol Group and later, Officer-in-charge of Provost Unit, at the Tanglin Police Division. Michael will work with SLSNT staff next week then accompany staff and volunteers to the SLSA Board of Lifesaving meetings in Sydney 1-5 July.

Adelaide to host 2012 World Life Saving Championships

The World Life Saving Championships, *Rescue 2012*, the largest international lifesaving event in the world, will be held in Adelaide following a successful bid by Surf Life Saving South Australia and the SA Government. Adelaide's quality facilities and compact size have won over officials from the International Life Saving Federation (ILS) and Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) that are visiting the city this week. More than 4,000 competitors and officials, plus thousands of spectators, are expected to travel to Adelaide from across Australia and overseas to take part in *Rescue 2012*. The key venues will be Christies Beach, Glenelg Beach and the future state-of-the-art Aquatic Centre at Marion. Glenelg will be the official 'accommodation hub' of Rescue 2012 and will become the athlete's village and festival location, with the opening and closing ceremonies to be conducted there, with all beach events to be held at twilight. Australia's Surf Lifesaver & Lifeguard of the Year on duty at Darwin Wave Lagoon

Lachlan Holbery-Morgan, is the first person in SLSA history to be recognised nationally as both the Surf Lifesaver of the Year and the Lifeguard of the Year. A member of Anglesea SLSC in Victoria and an employee of the Australian Lifeguard Service, Lachlan is on duty at the Darwin Wave Lagoon and is looking forward to learning more about lifeguarding and sharing his experience with our local staff. Lachlan is the chief lifeguard for beaches between Torquay and Apollo Bay in Victoria. With over six years of experience, he is also an award trainer and keen competitor. He's held a range of major positions at club and state level and competes in IRB racing at club, state and national level. Lachlan played a major role in the retrieval and attempted resuscitation of two Indian students during a tragic double drowning at Hutt Gully in December 2007. When Lachlan was awarded the two prestigous awards in March he said "Lifesaving never stops, it's a year-round commitment," he said.

CoastSafe Website is now inline

The <u>CoastSafe</u> website has gone live. Australian CoastSafe is the strategic and intelligence beach safety unit of Surf Life Saving Australia. The unit was established to gather data on all beaches around Australia and establish a framework to deliver a safer aquatic environment. CoastSafe provides support for surf lifesavers and lifeguards, but even more practically, offers cost-effective benefits to all levels of government, private developers and the tourism industry to reduce the risk of injury or death around the coast. CoastSafe has a number of key components - each has individual merit and when combined, they provide the most comprehensive beach safety management program in the world. These are made up of:

- 1. The Australian Coastal Public Safety Guidelines
- 2. The Australian Beach Safety and Management Programme

Air North could take you to Gove on Thursday or Friday evening (departs 5.45pm) and return you to Darwin Monday or Tuesday morning (departs 8.25am).
