SAR Team Closes Beaches for Big Croc

Surf Life Saving Northern Territory's SAR Team was called out on Thursday afternoon 26 June following reports of as 3-4 metre crocodile threatening beach goers in the Nightcliff area. The SAR Team quickly deployed our two Rescue Jetskis and patrolled beaches to warn beachgoers, fishermen and a sailing school of the threat. The action was taken as a precautionary measure in the interests of public safety with a small team focused on Mindil Beach where hundreds of people were gathering in the afternoon for a swim. Mindil Beach was targeted because the it is the city's most popular beach and the Darwin City Council had withdrawn funding for the Lifeguard service. Over 100 residents and visitors were in the water during the first sweep of the main beaches from Nightcliff to Cullen Bay – all heeded advice from lifesavers to retreat from the water. Later in the afternoon over 300 people were on Mindil Beach during a strong incoming tide with much appreciation offered to lifesavers for the advice and volunteer vigil they provided. A visual inspection of beaches from first light the next morning did not provide any crocodile sightings and the SAR Team was stood down. A big thankyou to the members who helped out during this incident especially – Amy Rudolph, Tony Snelling, Cameron Griffin, Paddy Donohoe, Tony Tilley, Helen Gould, Gary Wall, and our international lifesaver – Michael Chua.

Adelaide to host 2012 World Life Saving Championships

The World Life Saving Championships, *Rescue 2012*, the largest international lifesaving event in the world, will be held in Adelaide following a successful bid by Surf Life Saving South Australia and the SA Government. Adelaide's quality facilities and compact size have won over officials from the International Life Saving Federation (ILS) and Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) that are visiting the city this week. More than 4,000 competitors and officials, plus thousands of spectators, are expected to travel to Adelaide from across Australia and overseas to take part in *Rescue 2012*. The key venues will be Christies Beach, Glenelg Beach and the future state-of-the-art Aquatic Centre at Marion. Glenelg will be the official 'accommodation hub' of Rescue 2012 and will become the athlete's village and festival location, with the opening and closing ceremonies to be conducted there, with all beach events to be held at twilight. Hurry - Book flights for the NT Championships

The cheap flights to Gove, for the NT Surf Life Saving Championships are being rapidly gobbled up! Qantas provides a flight from Darwin to Gove every morning (Departs 6.30am) and a return flight every evening (Departs 8.25pm). At the beginning of June the cheapest fares were \$195 each way. Air North could take you to Gove on Thursday or Friday evening (departs 5.45pm) and return you to Darwin Monday or Tuesday morning (departs 8.25am). Flights at \$165 each way were still available and you can get Qantas Frequent Flyer points too!

Patrol Hours for Championships

All active members are reminded that they need to have completed 16 patrol hours by 31st July to be eligible for the 2009 NT Championships. These hours can include patrol duty last season from 1st August 2008. Active Reserve members must have accrued 8 hours. Long Service and Life Members are exempt. For new members, gaining their Surf Rescue Certificate or Bronze Medallion/Certificate II in Public Safety this season, there are concessions and these can be explained by your club's Director of Lifesaving or Club Captain.
