Lifesaving Champs on Saturday - Patrol, First Aid & IRB

The Darwin and Mindil Beach clubs will go head to head in some tense and exciting lifesaving competition this Saturday at Casuarina Beach. Both clubs have titles to defend. Mindil Beach hold the Champion Patrol title while Darwin holds the First Aid title and are slight favourites in the IRB events.

The event kicks off at 8.15 am with each 6-member Patrol Team facing the lifesaving theory paper as the first task. 3 from each team are selected for the resuscitation section while the other 3 compete in the Rescue Tube - Rescue Board Relay. The whole team then does the patrol scenario followed by the Surf Race, a swim of approximately 350m. First Aid competitors should be ready to go at 12 noon and IRB teams should be ready for 1 pm. A simple hamburger lunch will be available to competitors and officials so bring a few dollars to feed yourself. Spectators are welcome!

R&R Demonstration on Saturday afternoon

As part of the Lifesaving Championships on Saturday 1st August a demonstration of the R&R event (Rescue & Resuscitation) will be held in the early afternoon, around 2pm. The Junior R&R event will be highlighted - an excellent event to encourage discipline, teamwork and lifesaving skill amongst our younger members. Events for older age groups will also be explained by qualified R&R coaches visiting from Queensland. This is a must for anyone interested in R&R competition and coaching.

Helpers and Officials needed for Lifesaving Championships on Saturday

- Make-up! Someone to do make up for First Aid scenarios (fake blood, broken bones etc)

Thrifty Lifesaver Super League and Nippers at Nightcliff Beach to help Camp Quality

A Thrifty Lifesaver Super League, Nipper competitions and a range of community events will be held on Sunday 16th August at Nightcliff Beach. The events and activities will be associated with a special event, "The Great Seafood Beach Picnic" to raise funds for Camp Quality –the Children's family cancer charity that believes in bringing optimism and happiness to the lives of children and families affected by cancer. Nipper activities will commence at 9.00 am, community events commence at 11.00am while senior surf lifesaving events commence at 1.30 pm. A detailed program of events has been developed and is being sent to clubs.

Masters Competition Review Completed

A review of Masters competition has been completed by SLSA with the adopted recommendations detailed in SLSA Bulletin 1-09, available from the SLSA website. The main changes are:

- An older (open gender) age category of 70 years plus;
- More (older) Team Age groupings;
- More Women's age groupings for both selected individual and team events;
- Including the 2km/1km Beach Run events;
- The introduction of Masters events into the Australian Pool Rescue Championships.

The changes are effective immediately and will apply to the 2010 Australian Masters Surf Life Saving Championships and 2010 Australian Pool Rescue Championships.

End of an era as Kurrawa takes out the 2009 Australian IRB Championships

Kurrawa put an end to North Burleigh's winning streak, successfully taking out the 2009 Australian IRB Championships at Kawana Waters. Recently crowned Queensland champions, Kurrawa finished on 36 points ahead of four time consecutive champions North Burleigh (20) and Point Lookout (15). The three day competition attracted record entries, with more than 680 competitors taking part from New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, Victoria and Western Australia.

Australian Lifesaving Team wins at World Games

Last weekend the Australian Lifesaving Team fought back from a whopping 136 point deficit to defend its World Games title in steamy, choppy conditions at Sizihwan Bay Beach in Kaohsiung, a major city in Chinese Taipei. Australia finished with a total of 634 points after three days of competition, with Italy on 521 and New Zealand on 485. The Chinese challenge seemed overwhelming after a powerful two-day performance in the pool but melted away in the balmy ocean, and they finished fourth on 420 points. Team Captain and surf life saving elite competitor, Shannon Eckstein, said defending the title against the pool lifesaving powerhouses of Italy, China, and New Zealand, was a remarkable effort.

Patrol Hours for Championships

All active members are reminded that they need to have completed 16 patrol hours by 31st July to be eligible for the 2009 NT Championships. These hours can include patrol duty last season from 1st August 2008. Active Reserve members must have accrued 8 hours. Long Service and Life Members are exempt. For new members, gaining their Surf Rescue Certificate or Bronze Medallion/Certificate II in Public Safety this season, there are concessions and these are explained in SLSNT Championships circulars.
