New Rescue Jetskis arrive in Darwin

Two new Seadoo Rescue Jetskis have arrived in Darwin and are being fitted out at Territory Marine. The new machines are powered by 135hp 4-stroke engines and equipped with Wahoo Rescue Sleds. Members wishing to join the SAR Team and complete their RWC (Rescue Water Craft) Certificate should register their interest with SLSNT by calling 8985 6588 or emailing surf@lifesavingnt.com.au. A current SLSA Bronze Medallion and Certificate II in Public Safety is essential. Existing Search & Rescue (SAR) Team members will undergo an induction course on the new equipment as part of their annual proficiency check. Last year the SAR Team was called out three times to close beaches and numerous times for water safety duties.

Lifesaver of the Year a Hero at Darwin Bomb Attack

Craig Croke, SLSNT's Surf Lifesaver of the Year and President of the Mindil Beach SLSC, was on the spot when a home-made bomb exploded in an insurance office in Darwin's city centre yesterday (Wed 3 Feb). Craig, who works just around the corner, was walking past when the explosion occurred. 'Your lifesaving and emergency response training just kicks in,' Craig said today. 'In a few seconds you have to take in a lot of information. Some people were moving away, others were standing in shock and some were rushing forward to help. It was obvious there was a fire involved so I grabbed a fire extinguisher from an adjoining shop, as others did, and was able to reduce the fire so we could all safely help those with injuries and move away the bystanders from the toxic black smoke that was pouring out.' There has been public praise for the heroic actions of people like Craig from NT Police Commanders, Colleen Gwynne and Rob Kendrick.
